How to read these Tabs; Each fret on the Diatonic Scale is numbered. I suggest you number each fret 1 thru 12 in sequence, including the 6-1/2 fret.

These tabs should work with most 1 string fretted dulcimers,
And "Finger Dancing" on the melody string of a Mountain Dulcimer
or Diatonic Strummer.

0 = Open Note

7 =the "Sharp" fret

8 = the Octave fret

A = 10th fret

B = 11th fret

C = 12th fret

Underlined ( $\underline{X}$ ) = Bend note for "sharp"

Example of "Open G" tuning:
